ORDER OF MASS TEXTS

GLORIA

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory. Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father. Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world. have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our praver: you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father, Amen.

APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried: he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty: from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

THE NICENE CREED

Amen.



For the first time in over two decades, music-lovers in Hobart will have the opportunity to hear Thomas Tallis's Spem in alium when Melbourne choir Ensemble Gombert joins forces with Allegri Ensemble Chamber Choir to perform this mighty 40-part work in St. Mary's Cathedral. Made famous in recent times by the Tallis Scholars, *Spem in alium* is a masterpiece of Renaissance polyphony, weaving forty individual vocal lines (arranged in eight choirs of five voices) into an unforgettable aural tapestry. The program also features the Tasmanian premiere of a second 40-part motet, *Omnes angeli*, by contemporary Melbourne composer, Vaughan McAlley. IMPORTANT SUNDAY PARKING NOTICE (Does not apply to Saturday Vigil Mass)

St Joseph's has been issued with parking permits which cover the four spaces outside the church in Macquarie
Street (not the two spaces outside the Astor Grill), and eight spaces in Harrington Street from the corner down to the Monastery driveway.

Parishioners who use these spaces for masses on Sunday need to collect permits and display the appropriate one on your dashboard.

The permits cover you from 7am till 4pm on Sunday, but only for the designated 12 spaces.

New Parking Permits from 20th December 2023 to 19th December 2024 are available for collection.

CAR PARKING DURING SUNDAY MASS TIMES IS ALSO AVAILABLE IN ST JOSEPH'S CAR PARK VICTORIA ST, ENTER VIA COLLINS STREET. USE WHICHEVER VACANT SPOTS ARE AVAILABLE.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

SETS OF ENVELOPES for the New Financial Year 2024/2025 are now available.

If you are making contributions through the envelope system your new set can be collected from the Monastery after making arrangements with Denise during office hours on 6234 4866.

For record keeping purposes we will allocate the envelope number that you are currently using for this financial year. This will enable us to issue receipts at the end of each financial year to those people who have provided us with their name and address.

We have several anonymous contributors who ideally need a number so that we can accurately declare the number of people contributing to our parish finances.

For new contributors to Planned Giving, there are now sets of envelopes for collection in the Sacristy. Please ensure that you fill in the information sheet and return as soon as possible, even if you wish to remain anonymous, so that the envelope number can be recorded.

If you have started internet banking, you can continue to do so using your current envelope number as we will withdraw that set from general circulation. This enables you to use the envelopes if you choose to do so in the future.

PAY ID is our new method for one off donations, enabling you to send quick payments in real time.

SETUP PAYID:

- 1. Log on to your banking app and select 'Profile', then 'Manage PayID'.
- **2.** Choose which type of PayID you'd like to register, then follow the prompts.
- 3. Choose an account to link to your PayID.
- 4. Confirm the name others will see.

MAKE DONATIONS USING PAYID:

- 1. Open your banking app and select 'Pay someone'.
- **2.** Select PayID option, then Type: ABN, then Enter: 99 814 352 286.
- 3. Enter the amount.
- 4. Enter the description such as "Donation"
